- **Use effective web searches**

- **Check veracity of web resources**
 - Look for the information needed to cite the document

Ex, Thomas, P. (2004) Alien Caribbean Frogs in Hawaii. Retrieved August 02, 2004; from <http://www.hear.org/AlienSpeciesInHawaii/species/frogs/>

(This authors name is at the bottom of page, but you may need to search the homepage)

- Key elements: credited author, currency, publisher, URL type (e.g. .gov, .org, .edu, .com), cited information, point of view or bias
